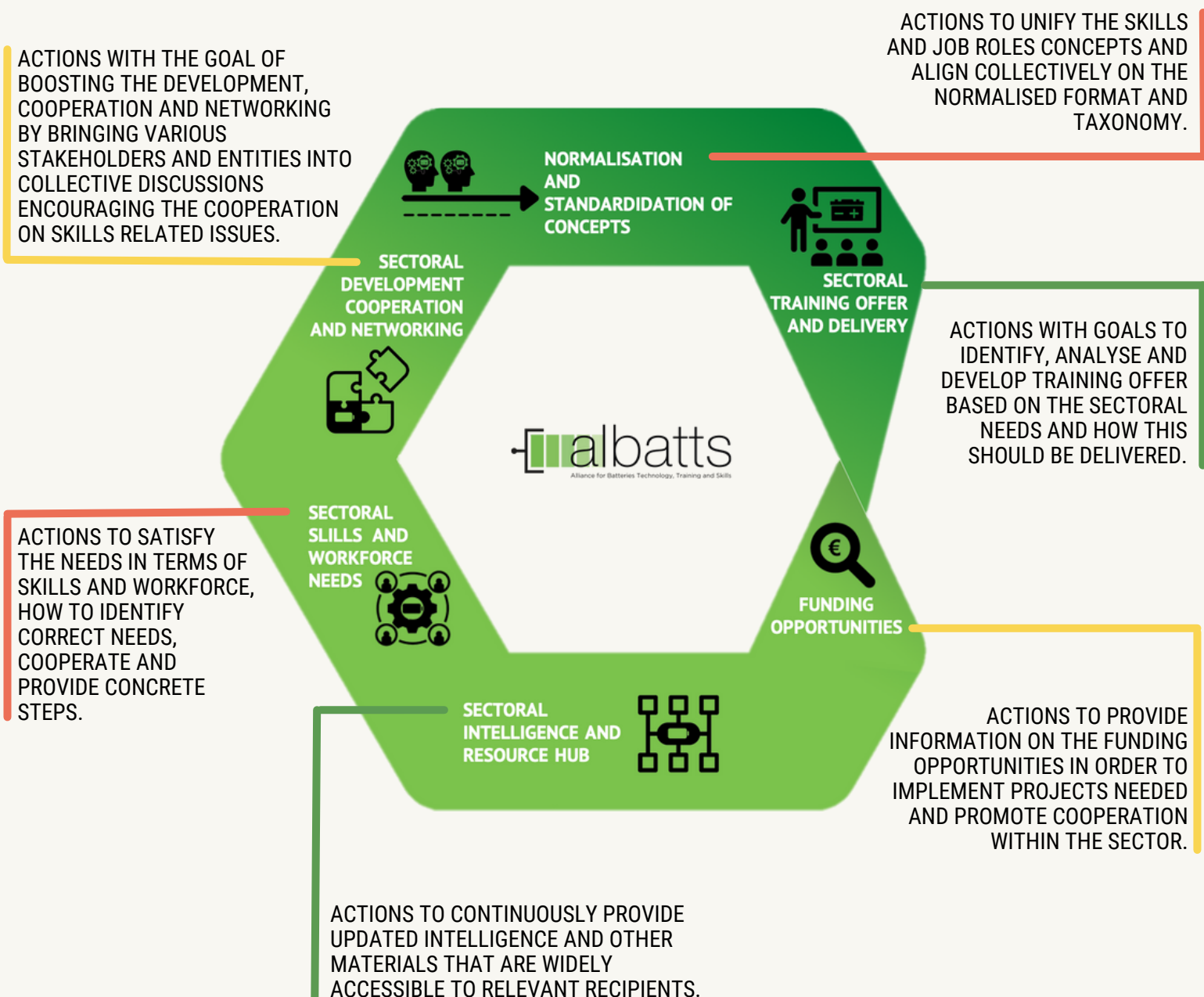


SECTORAL SKILLS STRATEGY FOR THE EUROPEAN BATTERY SECTOR
